

Our non-denominational summer camp program is a yearly event with many elementary and middle school youth returning to Epworth by the Sea each year. As part of their camp experience, we introduce them to the history that is found within our museum. In addition, we have two to three groups of inner city and minority youth who tour the museum during this time. Our goal is to engage and captivate all the campers, whether they are first time visitors or have been coming for many years. We are going to introduce a new museum movie which will be designed and directed by the intern. This video will bring history alive, using the voice talents of the intern and museum staff. Using important facts of each individual making it fun for the youth but having them learn something. Along with the new movie, the intern will design the tour which will cover specific areas of the museum that will then be used later for a game of Methodist Jeopardy. The intern will also be in charge of designing the game to ensure that the questions are part of the tour and the museum video. The game is designed so that the campers will be split up into two groups and the group that has the most points by the end will be the winner. The intern would then be in charge of administering the prize ribbons to the campers. During the time that the campers are not here, the intern will work with the staff and other volunteers to greet visitors, conduct research, and perform other tasks as directed by the Director. This position will give the intern experience in museum operations, library and archival work. Hours are 9:30am – 4:00pm Tuesday through Saturday. The intern position pays \$8.00 per hour and lodging is available on site at no charge. This is an ideal way to spend the summer for students of museum studies, history, theology, or archives.
